Classes in April 2021 and Medical Checkup Online classes are conducted for 2 weeks from the beginning of the first quarter

The current infection state of Covid-19 seems to be calm in nationwide. However, we see this situation still need to be taken careful countermeasures for a while.

In the point of view, we have decided that we set "Health monitoring period" that students do not go to campus except for medical checkup and research activities and stay home in principle in early April 2021, and KUT conduct online classes.

For all of students, we kindly ask you to act with infection prevention in your mind continuously for welcoming new academic year healthy. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation.

- 1 Health monitoring period (period to stay home)
- Health monitoring period : April 4th Sunday 18th Sunday
- Face to face classes start from April 19th Monday

Online classes are provided from April 8 Thursday to April 18th Sunday in the beginning of first quarter.

*University facilities such as Work Station Rooms, library and etc. are available for students who have a trouble in network environment or information devices to take online classes at home.

- Orientation is provided on online.
 *For international students, we provide orientation for new students who enroll in April 2021.
- During the health monitoring period, extracurricular activities in group and social events such as networking event for new students and current students are prohibited for all grade students. Also requesting to avoid going out unnecessarily.
 *If your organization have a special circumstances such as participating an official competitions, please contact Student Affairs Section.
- Research activities are allowed during the Health monitoring period with careful countermeasures, such as preventing the three C's etc.

2 Medical checkup (in face to face)

We conduct "medical checkup" in face to face with thorough infection prevention measures as an exemption for the reason that it is difficult to conduct medical checkup with online. Because it is during the period you are supposed to stay at home, each of you must act with infection prevention in your mind such as refraining from chatting and keeping social distances.

3 In case you are coming from outbreak areas

We still have asked for avoiding traveling to "outbreak areas"^{*1}. If you must travel to those area due to unavoidable circumstances, stay at home and monitor your health for a period of 14 days, with the day following your return to Kochi counted as the first day. Accordingly, please plan your travel to come back to Kochi 2 weeks before from the date of your medical checkup if your travel destination is designated as an outbreak area. You cannot join the research activities in campus as well for 2 weeks if you travel to "outbreak areas."
