Recently, I gave a presentation to a group of educators about New City School. In describing the school, I stated, "We value diversity and are pleased that 34 percent of our students are minorities, students of color." During the break, one of the audience members, a blind woman, came up to congratulate me on valuing diversity. She also chastised* me for talking about diversity solely in racial terms.

"What about me and others who have a physical disability?" she asked. "Don't we have minority status?"

I recognized that she was correct and apologized to her. She was accompanied by a friend, who then reminded me that religion can also be a form of diversity. "And don't forget sexual orientation," she said. I nodded because, of course, they both were right.

Too often, we fall into the trap of equating the term minority with people of color. We say "minorities" when we talk about people whose skin color is not white. Such language is not only incomplete and inaccurate, but it is also offensive to many people. When we speak only to race, we are ignoring all the people who are different from the majority in other ways and the implications that follow from their diversity.
